Frequently Asked Questions

1. What are Foresight Communities?

After much prayer and fasting, we felt convicted to create Foresight Communities, to facilitate our values of fostering authentic relationships inside of loving covenant communities. This is a “relational” shepherding model. There is a need for people to belong, to be cared for, to contribute and to be equipped. Community-based church is a decentralized structure where we promote active discipling by creating multiple ministry and growth opportunities. Herein we can be more intentional about raising, mentoring, and releasing leaders in smaller units. We want to lay a foundation that can sustain long term church growth in depth and breadth.

2. Why the “New Thing”?

The leadership team firmly believes that this is a God-given, sustainable model to improve our biblical commission to disciple, care and develop our people. It enables us to be outward-focused and missional in our structure as we vision and plan for future church growth. We need to grow smaller to grow bigger!

3. What happens if I want to bring visitors / friends to church that live in a different area?

Please bring/invite friends to your Community service, fellowship events and homegroup, even if they do not stay in the same geographical area. You are also welcome to freely join them in their geographical area Community allocated service time slot to help visitors meet people in their own area. That way you can help them to connect to people in their new Community. Either way..just bring them!

4. What if I cannot make my time slot, can I attend another service time?

Yes, you can join another service. We do, however, encourage you as far as possible to build sustainable friendships within your geographical area as well. (This is the purpose of Communities!) You are free to attend any service provided you register for that service, according to current level 3 regulations.

5. Why do we rotate communities though different time slots?

We rotate time slots to give everybody a fair chance to attend an early morning, late morning, or late afternoon service. We are trying to facilitate fairness and not disadvantage anyone.

6. Do I have to attend a homegroup within my community?

The purpose of Community structure is to facilitate sustainable relationships and discipling. Geographical proximity serves sustainability best due to time, travel, cost, and curfew restrictions. We therefore highly encourage homegroups in Communities in Foresight Church, but you are not restricted to attend the homegroups in your allocated Community. The homegroup you decide to attend is entirely up to you and your preference. We do encourage you to attend the fellowship occasions set up by your community so that you can meet the people in your area and grow in relationship.
